

# Twitter Makes Bangalore-Based ZipDial Its First Acquisition in India

Twitter announced that it has reached an agreement to acquire ZipDial, an Indian company that uses 'missed calls' as a means of connecting brands with the audience. This is Twitter's acquisition in India. Bangalore-based company's expertise will be used to make Twitter more first accessible around the world, the company said. The talks between Twitter and ZipDial were in the news this month and it was reported that the deal was already closed at between \$30 to \$40 million (approximately Rs. 185 crore to Rs. 247 crore).





# LinkedIn Users Being Targeted by Phishing Emails

Cybercriminals are now targeting LinkedIn users by scamming them into sharing their credentials by sending out mails claiming to be from the support team of the world's largest professional networking firm. It has observed an increase in phishing emails claiming to be from the US-based firm's support team. No immediate response was available from LinkedIn. "The body of the email claims that irregular activities have prompted a 'compulsory security update' for the recipients' LinkedIn account". The email uses a lowercase 'i' to spell LinkedIn, instead of capital 'I' as used by the firm. "The difference in characters is indiscernible to the eye and functions as a way to evade mail filters.





## Japan to Sell Talking Robots That Won't Try to Make Sense

The scientists behind a new talking robot in Japan says people should stop expecting robots to understand them, and instead try to chime in with robotic Ishiguro's Hiroshi conversations. 28-centimer (11-inch) tall button-eyed Sota, which stands for "social talker," is programmed to mainly talk with a fellow robot, and won't be trying too hard to understand human speech - the major, and often frustrating, drawback of companion robots. They could be used for tasks such as drawing attention to products on display. Japan is a leading maker of robots, and its repertoire has ranged from industrial robots and Internet toys. whimsical telecommunications company Softbank Corp. will start selling Pepper, a humanoid it claims is designed to read human emotions.

#### WhatsApp Web

WhatsApp announced the launch of WhatsApp Web enabling the use of the popular messaging app on desktop computers. While the solution isn't cross-platform and feels like a hack at first glance, it works surprisingly well. It managed to get its hands on the updated Android app that comes with WhatsApp Web support.For usage: Open the WhatsApp Web website on the desktop in Google Chrome. This is important as there's no standalone desktop app for WhatsApp. Once the WhatsApp Web page finishes loading, we will see a QR code on the top left part of the screen. Now fire up WhatsApp on the mobile phone and select WhatsApp Web from the menu (three dots). Align the QR code with the phone's camera and, almost instantly, we'll find ourself staring at our recent WhatsApp conversations inside Chrome on the desktop.



# TOP TECH PRODUCTS OF 2015

#### Microsoft's cheapest Web-ready phone to date:

Microsoft isn't to be left behind this year at the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas. The Redmond giant has used the event to showcase the Nokia 215, the cheapest Internet-ready mobile the company has produced to date.

The Nokia 215, available for just \$29 -- before taxes and subsidies -- is basic, but can help those with low budgets get on the grid. The 2G smartphone comes with Facebook, Messenger, Bing Search, Twitter and the Opera Mini browser pre-installed. In terms of hardware, the device sports a 2.4-inch QVGA 320 x 240 LCD display, 8MB RAM, Bluetooth and FM radio. Its single, front-facing camera has a 0.3 megapixel sensor.

#### Next-generation mobile gesture control:

Gesture recognition, from swipes to finger waves, is found on many of today's smartphones. However, Elliptic Labs wants to take this further -- and has demoed next-generation gesture control technology at CES 2015.



Elliptic Labs introduced the so-called "Multi Layer Interaction" technology at the show, using a mobile device as a test subject.

The technology enabled the device to display and shift content depending on the location and distance a user's hand was from the device. For example, when watching a video on a smartphone, controlling buttons appear as a hand approaches the device. This lets the user see how much time is left on the video, and they are also able to quickly forward or rewind without smudging the screen.

#### Roku's plans:

Roku, maker of radio and tv streaming devices, rocked up to CES 2015 with plans to tackle the TV market.



which give consumers access to over 2,000 channels without the subscription fees of traditional cable. While many smart TVs automatically include access to free streaming channels, these products do pinpoint what consumers now expect from the content industry -- access, without contracts that chain consumers for years on end. The Haier Roku TV 4 Series Smart LED HD TVs, available from Q3, are available in sizes ranging from 32-inches to 65-inches.

#### A discreet timepiece, activity tracker:

When enthusiasm for wearables begins to wane after half a year of wearing it, the often high price of such devices can make you regret such a purchase. However, the newly debuted Withings Activite Pop, available for \$149.95, could be a more justifiable investment. The fitness tracker, paired with a



smartphone, is able to record your steps, running patterns, swimming -- as the product is

water-resistant up to 30 meters -- and collates this data and more into a summary displayed on your phone. In addition, you can join up with friends to compete, with daily results pinned on a shared leaderboard.

In addition, the device looks like a standard watch with a traditional timepiece, so you can keep your activity tracking to yourself if you wish.

# Hackers Target German Steel

Cybersecurity experts have warned that bad actors will use malware to damage real world objects. The 'Scholven' coal plant, pictured here, is similar to the steel mill that suffered "massive" furnace damage.

Hackers infiltrated a German steel mill and made it impossible to safely shut down a furnace. The breach, which caused "massive" damage, marks just a second time a digital attack caused physical damage, highlighting growing fears that cyberwarfare will soon impact more than computers and networks. Few specifics are provided in Germany's Federal Office for Information Security report, first obtained by Wired, other than that the hackers obtained access via a spearphishing attack quickly moving before "multitude" of sensitive corporate

networks. Who the hackers were, how long they were in the system, whether they intended to destroy the furnace and what, if any, other equipment they accessed all remains unclear.

"The know-how of the attacker was very pronounced not only in conventional IT security but extended to detailed knowledge of applied industrial controls and production processes," said the German-language report, according to a Wired translation.

This hack comes after the U.S. and Israeli governments deployed the Stuxnet worm against the Iranian government, which is believed to have destroyed nearly one-fifth of the country's uranium enrichment facilities used to make nuclear weapons.



## HIDE A FILE - STEGANOGRAPHY

Hiding a file in an image file is called 'Steganography'. Its a technique using which we can exchange data across the world over internet without using any encryption or decryption method. What happens actually is we just bind the file (we want to send) with an image file. The actual file becomes hidden within an image file and hence becomes more protected. The image file functions normally as it should. Even if someone snoop into our network and gets his hands on over that image, he just can't unbind the actual file hidden within that image until unless he doesn't know the exact trick. Lets see how to do this.


Follow the steps below carefully.

#### STEP 1: Hiding the File



Create a new folder anywhere in your system. For example: "D:\NewFolder".

#### STEP 2:




Select all files you want to hide and get them zipped using WinZip or WinRar.Let this file is named as 'womb.rar'.

#### STEP 3:



Select an image file like 'ppp.jpg' in which you want to hide your created zip folder 'womb.rar'.

#### STEP 4:



Place both 'ppp.jpg' and 'womb.rar' into the folder you created in step 1.


#### STEP 1: Accessing the Files

Realize that 'ppp.jpg' is a JPEG extension file. Hence its properties will remain same. It'll work like any other JPEG image file. But your data 'womb.rar' is still hidden within it.

#### STEP 2:

#### Know that there are two file extraction methods:

Method 1: Simply right-click 'ppp.jpg' and select 'open with winrar'. You (or anyone you send the file to) can see 'womb.rar' zipped file there. Just unzip it and here your all files are.



Method 2: Change the extension from 'ppp.jpg' to 'ppp.rar'. Then, double-click to open it. You can see 'womb.rar' zipped file there. Just unzip it, and here you can see your files.

#### INTEL DEMOS

A BUTTON-SIZE WEARABLE COMPUTER

The world's largest chip maker, Intel, hopes an itty-bitty computer will mean better wearable gadgets. Intel CEO Brian Krzanich holds the company's tiny computer for wearables. It just got a lot easier to build wearable gadgets that aren't so bulky or awkward.

Intel CEO Brian Krzanich showed off a minuscule computer, dubbed Curie, during a keynote speech at the International Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas on Tuesday. Krzanich plucked a button off his blazer before explaining that it contained a Curie demo module. Curie is a sure sign that hardware makers are eager to build wearable devices of all kinds. It also points to the unwelcome size of many existing smart watches and smart glasses.



Intel's new device will include a Bluetooth low-energy radio, motion sensors, and components designed to rapidly and precisely differentiate between different types of physical activity. Krzanich said Curie will run "for extended periods of time" on a coin-size battery and would be available in the second half of the year.

Curie appeared much smaller than a postage-stamp-size computer, called Edison, that Krzanich showed off at last year's CES.

The world's largest chip maker evidently sees wearable's as one of the most important categories in consumer electronics. It's a belief held by a lot of other companies at CES, where gadgets meant to be worn on the body or clipped to clothing were all over the show floor this year.

To make it clear that Curie is already functional, the company built a simple step-tracking smartphone app to go with the module Krzanich had on him; at one point he pulled the phone out of his pocket, and its display indicated he'd taken 1,788 steps during the keynote.

As part of its wearable's push, Intel has partnered with a number of companies in the fashion and accessories businesses, including Luxottica Group, which is the world's largest eyeglass maker with brands such as Ray-Ban and Oakley. Krzanich said Luxottica will use Curie to make "truly consumer-friendly" smart glasses—a notoriously tricky thing to do, in part because of the size of



components needed to make them work.

Oakley CEO Colin Baden joined Krzanich on stage to talk about wearable's, which Oakley has built in the form of devices like ski goggles that include a head-up display. When you put a wearable device on your face, Baden said, it becomes part of your personality. "It's important the form factor compress so the electronic component of it doesn't become burdensome," he said.

Microsoft is conducting a serious overhaul on the web browser for its upcoming Windows 10. Code named Spartan, precious little was known about the browser's features, until now that is. Neowin.com announced that it was sent leaked images of the new browser, allowing us to piece together a little more information.

Right off the bat, the design has clearly deviated from standard Internet Explorer aesthetics, and is more in line with Google's Chrome now. Standard browser tabs sit above the search bar, albeit with more rounded edges now, and minimalistic forward, back, and refresh buttons to the side. On the right end of the search bar is a "star to favourite" button, and a "reading mode" button, that strips away multimedia in the page, leaving only the text for easier reading.

To the right of the search bar are three buttons for folder access, sharing, and a triple dot icon to access the browser menu, similar to Microsoft's menu access for Windows Phone OS. One of the features supposedly included is an annotation feature, that allows the user to make notes on a web page and share it with a friend. This is powered by Microsoft's OneDrive, indicating their push to standardise their cloud storage and sharing across devices. And once shared, multiple users can make notes on the same copy, similar to Google Docs.


# "Microsoft's - Spartan browser will also have voice activation"

Microsoft's digital helper and Siri's counterpart, Cortana, is also a major part of the newSpartan browser. Although not yet visible in the screenshots released, the functionality is expected to be a trigger icon in the header. Cortana is also expected to replace all forms of Bing search in the browser.

The design leaning towards a Chrome look is not very surprising, considering Spartan is being built to look and feel similar across all of Microsoft's upcoming devices. It's also expected to be a made a Windows Store app, allowing Microsoft to push across updates easily. And while Spartan is what the new browser is being called, it's only a code name so far, and it's as yet unknown if it will be officially branded according to Internet Explorer tradition.
